In terms of transparency and information provision, Micro-credentials are generally applicable as a emerging **new type of LLL small learning units**, which do have their place in National qualifications framework **if they lead to** a final qualification.

The National qualifications framework of Bulgaria is open to this emerging new category of LLL learning units just as any other.

The current national legislation of Bulgaria **in the field of higher education** does not distinguish the micro-credentials among other learning units.


Hence all national and Bologna principles and rules for higher education are applicable for micro-credentials and **first of all external quality assurance**.

> The lack of specific national legislation could **serve as an advantage** in this respect, providing to HEIs as education providers the **opportunity** within their academic autonomy **to search their**



own pathways to design and implement Micro-credentials in the context of their study programs and course catalogues.

Bulgarian HEIs-respondents



The selection was based on desk research and information available about **national and international initiatives and projects** in the field of micro-credentials.

Subsequently, an online Survey and Interview were made **available for all Bulgarian** universities to be filled out.

Thus all 52 Bulgarian universities had the opportunity to participate in the survey and the interview.

As a result there were total of **13 respondents to the Survey** and **10 respondents to the interview**.

Bulgarian universities, involved in international initiatives and projects in the field of micro-credentials

- One Bulgarian university (Technical University of Sofia) is involved in the micro-credentials subject within an international group of universities, namely together with the other seven founders of the European University of Technology EUt+ with the following HEIs from the project partner countries: Riga Technical University (Latvia), Universitatea Tehnică din Cluj-Napoca (Romania) and Technological University Dublin (Ireland).
- Another Bulgarian university (University of National and World Economy) is involved in the micro-credentials subject within the alliance of leading European universities ENGAGE. EU.






Results of the Surveys

Does your institution provide micro-credentials?






b. Part of study programme (courses, part of the courses etc.)

- Four of the responding universities replied to question № 3 "Is the information of these learning opportunities available on your institution's website?" with "Yes" and one with "No".
- Three of the universities (VTU,VFU and University "Prof. D-r Assen Zlatarov" -Burgas) responded to the question "**If information is available** on outside information sources, **does institutions webpage provide information on these** learning opportunities?" with "Yes, with short description and links".
- Question № 4 "If information is available on other information sources, please list them:" was replied by the two responding universities answered referring to Social media and the website of the Bulgarian Ministry of Education and Science.

"Is workloads measured in ECTS / other credit points?"


Three of the responding universities gave the same affirmative answer "Yes".


The other two answered with "No"

Conclusions

- The main challenges with implementation of micro-credentials are associated with the challenges typical to all learning units generally, especially the challenges with learning units of international mobility within other European initiatives and programs like "ERASMUS +".
- Micro-credentials are great opportunity for effective connecting of HE learning outcomes with market and social needs. It is also an opportunity for HEIs to adopt and implement them within their academic autonomy or within national and international university networks.
- Micro-credentials are recognized as beneficial for a wide range of stakeholders as training opportunities that focus on "in demand" workplace skills which provide real-world learning experiences, especially for emerging new skills, competencies and knowledge.
