## **Short history**

- ▶ Higher education, Short cyle and long cycle
  - $\rightarrow$  Organised by university colleges
- ▶ Higher education, Long cycle
  - $\rightarrow$  Organised by universities
- ▶ Higher education, Short cycle, for social promotion
  - $\rightarrow$  Organised by centres for adult education



## **Short history**

- ▶ 2004-2005: Bachelors and masters
- ▶ 2009: Decree on qualification structure

Secondary education - orientation to higher education	Level 4
Associate degree (SCHE)	Level 5
Professional / Academic Bachelor	Level 6

## **Short history**

#### ▶ 2013-2014:

- → **Professional bachelors**: university colleges
- → Academical bachelors: universities
- → Arts programmes (bachelor + master): Schools of Arts
- → Associate degree programmes: centres for adult education, but in collaboration with university college



### A new start

#### ▶ 2019-2020:

Associate degree programmes: university colleges

- $\rightarrow$  New programmes, based on 'professional qualifications'
- $\rightarrow$  Attract more youngsters, not forgetting 'original public'
- $\rightarrow$  1/3 workbased learning
- ightarrow 90 or 120 ECTS



### A new start

- Clear position: "It is higher education"
- A third option for youngsters
  - $\rightarrow$  Professional bachelor (UC)
  - $\rightarrow$  Academical bachelor (U)
  - $\rightarrow$  Associate degree (UC)
- Missing step between secondary education and bachelor





### Offer of programmes










## A comparison

Centres for Adult Education	University colleges
2018-2019: 12.539 students	2023-2024: 23.400 students
2018-2019: 52% > 25y	2022-2023: 25% >25y
No grants – but low fee for certains groups	38% receives grant




## A comparison (2)





## After the programme (2022)



1 year after graduation: on average 2,7% has no job (PBA 2,1%) Commercial science and business management: 5%

-> competition with PBA profiles?

Lowest unemployment: teacher for technical subjects (basic)nursing



## Challenges

- Even more students will enrol
  - $\rightarrow$  Demographical evolution
  - $\rightarrow$  Attractive programmes
  - $\rightarrow$  Big demand from the labour market
  - $\rightarrow$  QF level 3 will have no direct access to bachelor
  - → Stricter measures in BA programmes to ensure study progress
- Financing by governement doesn't rise in the same way
- Students need more support / guidance than bachelorstudents
- Work based learning is time consuming
- UC have no initiative to develop new programmes

The second
